



2019 NMAA STATE BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIPS **REPLAY PROTOCOL (OFFICIALS)**



The 2019 NMAA State Basketball Championships mark the first year that replay will be used in concert with the NFHS Basketball Rulebook Rule 2.2.1, which states:

“A state association may permit game or replay officials to use a replay monitor during state championship series contests to determine if a scored goal at the expiration of time in the fourth quarter or any overtime period (0:00 on the game clock) should be counted and, if so, determine if it is a two-point or a three-point goal.”

Monitor Situations

- **Logistics**
 - Where is it located?
 - UNM – Monitor at scorer’s table; ProView at the top – radio with alternate official.
 - SASC - Monitor at scorer’s table; ProView at the top – radio with alternate official.
 - Bernalillo HS – Monitor with ProView crew on balcony. Officials to be escorted by security or NMAA staff to view.
- **Protocol**
 - Keep all participants in their team boxes
 - Two at a time will view; third official keeps everyone back
- **Make sure we have a definite call on the floor!**
 - Signal as if no monitor is involved.
 - Report foul (if called) to scorer.
- **Prior to viewing**
 - Confirm call on court.
 - Basket good or no good, two or three.
 - Inform coaches what we are looking for:
 - Good or no good, two or three, possible time left.
- **While viewing**
 - Look for all issues – good or no good, two or three.
 - Referee and calling official view first.
 - If referee is calling official, U1 first.
 - No verbal communication that can be heard by anyone.
 - Referee – ask the third official if he/she has an opinion or information.
 - If yes, bring third official in to view
- **Post-viewing**
 - All three officials communicate away from sideline to determine ruling.
 - Referee stands facing table.
 - Short blast of whistle, signal “3,” if necessary, count or cancel.
